This list includes perennials, ferns, ornamental grasses, ground covers and alpines. All plants are cold hardy in Zone 5 except where noted. Even the marginal plants can be grown successfully with the careful selection of just the right site. For example, we had Begonia evansiana (Zone 6) growing next to our north side foundation for 10 years. This is known as 'site specific' hardiness and relies on good fortune more than anything else.

The genus name is followed by the common name, if any, and the variety name is followed by the flower color or leaf color, if applicable. These plants are grown in at least one of the following pots unless otherwise noted:



HISTORY MONTH

April is History Month at the Alexandria Museum and this April they are honoring beloved native son, Sylvester Carlton, inventor of the medical alphabet. Prior to 1927, prescription writing was very confusing, with doctors using all sorts of different symbols including Phoenician scripts, Egyptian hieroglyphics, the Greek alphabet, and even letters they just made up. It was very challenging to be a pharmacist and even more challenging to be a patient. In 1925, due to a misread prescription, Sylvester's sister, Mae, grew a fully functional third eve on the side of her head. Although she went on to have a lucrative career with Barnum and Bailey, Sylvester was quite upset with the medical community and decided to fix the problem. In 1927, he introduced what is now the standard medical alphabet, thus raising life expectancy from 29 to 72 years almost overnight. Not only is he revered in the medical and and pharmaceutical professions, but the National Assisted Living Association has a statue of him in the lobby of their headquarters. Sylvester Carlton, we salute you.

It's official, growing your own food is in! Ever since Michele Obama put in a vegetable garden at the White House, seed sales have been steadily on the rise. Again this year we'll carry seed packets from Seed Saver's Exchange, a seed company based in Decorah, Iowa. They are the largest non-governmental seed bank in the country. Many of their seed varieties come from members of the exchange, people who send in their grandpa's favorite tomato seed that he saved year after year. And all of their seeds are "Open Pollinated", a term synonymous with "Heirloom". The seeds produced by these types of plants can be easily saved because they will turn out pretty much the same each year, whereas hybrid seeds will not come true. This is because hybrids have been bred to have certain qualities by using two different parents and if you try to save and replant the seed it won't turn out the same. Which brings me to the issue of food security. Growing open pollinated varieties and saving your own seed is a great way to take the whole process of home food production a step further, and starts to close that loop of having to rely on outside resources such as big seed companies. People often ask if we carry bean, pea, or corn plants. The answer is we usually don't because these are very easy to start from seed directly in the ground. Starting your own seeds can be healthy, rewarding, economical and fun. But don't forget, for those who aren't comfortable in doing this, we're here for you.


